#### **Winter Concert**

Monday, December 13th at 7:00 PM

(Snow Date is set for 12/15)

The concert is free and open to the public. Audience members are encouraged to bring 1 canned good for donation to local food pantries. The audience will be asked to remain masked and socially-distanced.

The Winter Concert will feature both holiday and secular tunes – covering a wide variety of musical genres. The concert will open with the CHRHS Chorale singing the traditional South African freedom song: "Tshotsholoza" with the solo sung by Joshua Kohlstrom (December VPA Student of the Month). Additional selections include "Star of Bethlehem" by John Williams and "Seal Lullaby" by Eric Whitacre. The CHRHS Treble Choir will perform the traditional "Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas" and new piece for chorus titled "Where the Light Begins" by Susan LaBarr and Jan Richardson. The Chamber Singers will open with the traditional "Irish Blessing" and close with "Earth Song," an a cappella piece by Frank Ticheli.

During a brief intermission, while the stage is reset for the instrumental portion, the student-led a cappella ensemble "Fortissima" will perform a couple of holiday selections in the Wave Café.

The instrumental portion of the concert will kick off with the CHRHS Jazz Band performing "Blues for Percy." Composed by Maine composer Terry White, "Blues for Percy" is an uptempo blues chart loaded with improvisation and an energetic shout chorus. Things will switch gears a bit with the introduction of "Theme from Barney Miller," from the 1970's television series "Barney Miller." The jazz band will round out their performance with "The Christmas Song" (Chestnuts Roasting on an Open Fire) and a very brisk performance of the "Theme from the Flintstones," featuring many of the performers from the CHRHS Jazz Band. The Concert Band will begin things with a transcription from the finale of Dvorak's "Symphony No.9." A Frank Tichelli ballad entitled "Boundless River," followed by Randall Standridge's "Affirmation," a piece written about peace, love, and music, will conclude the instrumental part of the program.

The concert will conclude with the combined bands and choruses performing holiday favorites such as "Winter Wonderland" and "Joy to the World."

#### Photo & Mixed Media Carolyn Brown, Teacher

Photo & Mixed Media classes just finished a unit on LIGHT with several projects. For an assignment called

Painting with Light, they learned camera controls on

DSLR cameras, and used shutter speed, ISO and fstop variations to capture light selectively with slow shutter speeds. This process needs a darkened room (or nighttime), so students created a mini dark "studio" by hanging black paper and fabric in the jewelry area.



Another aspect of this unit was inspired by Paul Strand's early abstract photos

of objects and shadows. Students constructed sculptures with tagboard with the goal of altering light by creating texture and interesting form. They shot closeup photos of these with strong lighting, creating abstract shadow photos of their own.

An "at home" part of this unit was observing, and shooting photos of, interesting light situations in the world around them. They considered shadows, reflections, backlighting, light at the "Golden Hour" and other situations.

The current unit for this class is "Black and White Maine";

students are

studying the work of Maine photographers.

They are learning to see and photograph in black and white, which entails more awareness of value, shape and texture. They'll be making small block prints based on their photos or original drawings, to explore this concept in another media.

Next, they are working with texturing and forming copper, learning tools and methods for stamping, chasing and raising.



Unified Basketball practices informally begin during Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday Flex Times. The season begins after the








