

Hello CHILLS parents,

In March, the CHRHS counseling office launched the "CHILLS Counseling Corner" blog. This progressive information resource is free and can be obtained by simply going to our CHRHS Counseling web page and clicking on the link. Once you have accessed the blog, you will have the ability to subscribe to the blog for free and will received emails prompting you when there is a new post.

We are also excited to introduce our school community to <u>Colleges from the Couch</u>. This element of the counseling page will give you access to detailed break downs of various universities informed by our in-person experiences of visiting these campuses.

In other exciting news - on **Thursday, April 27th -** in the Strom Auditorium and the Wave Cafe, we will be hosting the new and improved **Midcoast Career and Education Fair,** a next level upgrade of our traditional career and college fair. This is not your parents' college fair! We are expecting a large number of people from different districts, so this event is offered in **2 sessions 4:30-6pm** and **6:30-8pm**. The guiding principle for the event is to make it possible for attendees to walk away with an acceptance to community college and/or having been hired for a summer or permanent job. Sandwiched in between the sessions will be a keynote by <u>Maine State Economist</u> Amanda Rector (a 2000 CHRHS alum!), who will speak about Maine's future economy and what will need to happen for Maine to remain viable in the coming decades.

To that end, we will have representatives on hand from each of **Maine's seven Community Colleges** for **on-the-spot admissions**. Just bring a transcript (we will help with that) and you could leave with an acceptance letter. Don't forget that graduates from the Classes of 2020-2023 are eligible for free community college (\$8K value). Check out this <u>list of available</u> programs!

We will also have representatives from a broad range of **40+ local businesses hiring on the spot**, so you could leave with a job too! Armed Forces recruiters will be on hand as well.




