


THE ANNEX

Many glue sticks later...






Algebra 1ALora Levenseller & Jacalyn Williams, Teachers




Germany Exchange 2023-24




Congratulations to all our coaches and student/athletes who are working so hard.

coaches will be picking teams after the first couple of days.




Good luck to everyone as the Fall season winds down, and I look forward to seeing everyone out enjoying the great weather and supporting the kids.

Kirsten Campbell, Teacher




Advanced Art/Portfolio started the year with Mind Maps, a brainstorming exercise that can lead to an art piece

Each student investigated Who they are as Artists - as juniors and seniors in high school.


Materials and techniques came together to create a visual representation of the group.

Jewelry Carolyn Brown, Teacher

Classes started the semester with wire projects-learning to anneal, wrap, bend, texture, make wire jigs for forming repeated shapes, and use tools safely. We looked at Alexander Calder's wire-based jewelry for inspiration, and designed our own pieces by drawing with a single continuous line.

Next was forging wire and sheet metal, changing the shape through repeated annealing and hammering, to make copper and brass bracelets. We're currently learning how to solder fine wire, 16-10 gauge, to make rings, hoops and other closed shapes.

Advanced Drawing and Painting and Drawing 2 Carolyn Brown, Teacher



Classes first warmed up for the semester with contour drawing studies of natural objects, and interior spaces. We looked at seed pods, wild flowers and plants, animal skulls, shells, pine cones. We then carried that sense of close observation to interior spaces, with varied line, composition,

and depth of space.

Advanced Drawing and Painting has moved on to figure drawings, and a project on expressive self portraits that incorporate text and images.

Drawing 2 has moved on to drawing hands, and a longer assignment on using hands to convey emotion or an idea.


