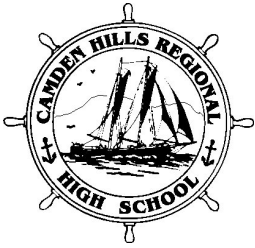


Camden Hills Regional High School

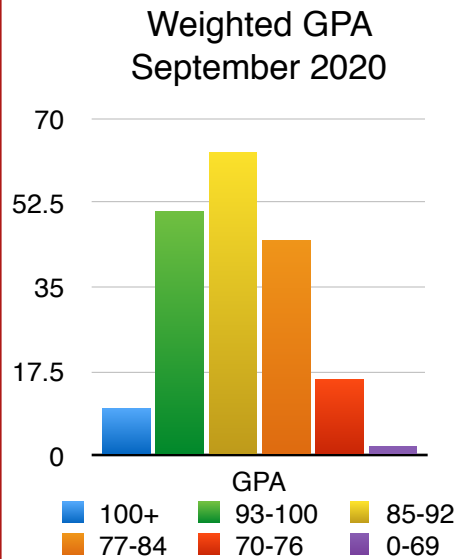

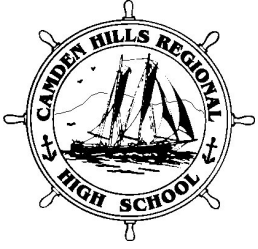

COVID-19 School Profile Addendum

Grading

In the spring of 2020, CHRHS ceased in-person instruction on March 13th due to COVID-19. While a robust virtual structure around remote learning in conjunction with our “Remote Snow Day” program had already been developed, making our transition to remote learning instantaneous, we recognized that remote learning is not equivalent to in-person instruction. To this, we decided that because our 3rd quarter was mostly completed at the time of this transition, we encapsulated 1st semester and 3rd quarter into a grading period that resembled our traditional grading structure for an academic year. The modification made in order to compensate for the extraordinary set of circumstances that COVID-19 presented at that time, was to create a standalone 4th quarter, represented on our transcript as “19-20 Camden Hills Remote Learning”. This standalone grading period was completely remote, with a grade range of “P” for pass or “F” for fail. All classes carried a .25 credit value regardless if they were originally a yearlong class or semester based. Because these classes were pass / fail in value, they were not factored into a student’s GPA.

Standardized Testing

It is important to note, the test score data on the CHRHS Profile represents the recently graduated Class of 2020. In the past in the state of Maine, we have been able to administer “School Day” testing, enabling us to have an extremely high degree of test taking compliance. With the closing of our facility in the spring of 2020, we were unable to administer the SAT. Statistics for our current senior class represent a much smaller cohort of students, and in turn, a skewed representation of that cohort’s performance on the 2019- 2020 SAT.
