

FIVE TOWN CSD POLICY

SCHOOL PROVIDED MLTI DEVICE USE

The Maine Learning Technology Initiative (MLTI) was instituted by the State of Maine to provide one-to-one computer access for all high school students and teachers. In addition, the intent of the initiative is to provide access to this technology at home as well as at school. The focus of MLTI is teaching and learning.

The MLTI device, its carrying case, and its charger are the property of the State of Maine and are registered to Camden Hills Regional High School. They are assigned to the student and his/her family and MUST be returned undamaged at the end of the school year. Students transferring or exiting Camden Hills Regional High School are expected to turn in their device, charger, and case immediately.

The use of the device at school/home is a privilege, not a right. This privilege can be revoked for inappropriate use, neglectful treatment, or deliberate mistreatment of the device and the accessories listed in the paragraph above.

The Superintendent shall be responsible for overseeing the implementation of this policy and the accompanying rules and for advising the Board of the need for any future amendments or revisions to this policy. The Superintendent may develop additional administrative procedures/rules governing the day-to-day management and operations of the Five Town CSD School Provided MLTI device usage as long as they are consistent with the Board's policy. The Superintendent may delegate specific responsibilities to building administrators and others as he/she deems appropriate.
